The required number of persons, duly qualified for membership, having applied, therefor, and such application having been approved, in due form.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the powers conferred by the Constitution of The American Legion, this Charter is granted, and those applying together with such others, as may unite with them, are hereby authorized to establish and maintain a Post of

THE AMERICAN LEGION

at Cedar Hill, to be known as S. Gus Alexander, Jr. Memorial Post No. 111 Department of Texas, and this instrument, unless revoked or suspended, shall be conclusive evidence of the lawful existence thereof.

By the acceptance of this Charter, the said Post acknowledges irrevocable jurisdiction, and declares itself to be in all things subject to the Constitutions of The American Legion and of the Department of Texas, and the rules, regulations, orders and laws promulgated in pursuance thereof; and further, the said Post pledges itself, through its members, to uphold, protect and defend the Constitution of The United States and the principles of true Americanism, for the common welfare of the living and in solemn commemoration of those who died, that liberty might not perish from the Earth.

In Witness Whereof, this Charter is given under the hand and seal of the National Commander, duly attested by the National Adjutant, at Headquarters, in Indianapolis, Indiana, this 19th day of May, 1993, and countersigned by the Commander and the Adjutant for the Department of Texas at Austin, the 29th day of May, 1993.
