Charles Nations was born in Dallas, Texas on March 15, 1945. Charles grew up in Dallas and graduated from South Oak Cliff High School.



Charles entered the United States Army on April 25, 1967 and took basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. After completing basic training, he was assigned Advanced Individual Training (AIT) at Fort Sam Houston, Texas. After AIT, Charles was stationed in Korea and trained in Chemical Biological Radiological (CBR) Warfare. While in Korea, he was the CBR instructor for the 618th Medical Company and also served as the acting Motor Sergeant. From Korea, Charles was assigned to the Hawk Missile Battery surrounding Homestead AFB, FL. as a medic (91B30) in the Headquarters Company. During his years of service with the U.S. Army, Charles was awarded the Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, and Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal. Charles was honorably discharged from the Army on April 23, 1971 after reaching the rank of Sergeant (E-5).

After leaving the military, Charles pursued a career in the automotive services industry working for a variety of companies before going into business for himself. He also attended Cedar Valley Junior College.
