

Patrick (Pat) Michael McEnroe II

Pat was born in Houston, Harris County, Texas on July 22, 1937. Pat has had a lifetime affiliation with the Boy Scouts of America in which he earned Scouting's highest rank of Eagle Scout. As a Sea Scout, he advanced to their highest level – the Silver Award. He was a member of the “Jolly Roger” (Sea Scout Ship 24) in Houston, where he learned to sail in their Gloucester Sloop, the Jolly Roger IV. He joined the U.S. Navy Reserves in 1954, attended Georgia Tech as a Co-Op student and graduated from Emory University. Pat attended boot camp in San Diego, California and was honorably discharged as a Petty Officer 3rd Class (ETN3) in 1962.



Pat had a 45 year career in Insurance Claims and another 11 years as a general agent earning the professional designations of CPCU, AIC, ALCM, ARM, and CPIM. He has recently joined a multi-state construction firm and is preparing for the Florida General Contractor's license with classes and 16 hours of examinations in the next few months.

Pat is currently serving as Finance Officer and continues to serve as the Oratorical Chairman for American Legion Post 111 located in Cedar Hill, TX. He has also served in the past as Trustee for Post 111. Commissioned as an Admiral of the Texas Navy on February 8, 1966 by Governor John Connally, Pat co-founded the Chester W. Nimitz Squadron of the Texas Navy in 2005. He has served that body as Personnel Officer and has served the Texas Navy Association as Treasurer and Membership Director.

Pat lives with his wife, Myrna, in Desoto, Texas. They have a daughter, Amanda, and a son, Mark. Three grandchildren round out their family. Their son Mark is a Colonel in the U.S. Air Force at Eglin AFB and is Commander of the 33rd MXG, where he is training the Navy, Marine and Air Force personnel to keep the F-35 Joint Services Fighter flying. Mark served on the original design and advisory committee for the F-35 before it was built by Lockheed in Fort Worth. Mark's son, Kyle, is a 1st LT pilot in the U.S. Air Force stationed at Barksdale AFB, LA flying B-52s.

As an avid reader and historian, Pat spends much of his time working on the genealogies of four families and researching Texas history, as well as the Civil War and World War II. He also does the Commissioning Ceremony for the new Admirals in the Texas Navy, where a history of the three Texas Navies is recited for the attendees.
